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THE YEAR IN HIGHLIGHTS:

Celebrated our 10TH ANNIVERSARY in service

Attended the 20th Bank of America NEIGHBORHOOD BUILDERS LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE in Charlotte

Hosted 36 TOOL SCHOOL TRAININGS and trained 171 INDIVIDUALS

Launched an INDIVIDUAL TOOL LENDING program in partnership with the Rosenberg Library for their cardholders

Donated 184 VOLUNTEER BUILD PROJECTS to community organizations and schools for their programs

Partnered with Texas Congregational Disaster Readiness (TXCDR) to hold a disaster preparedness training that covered mucking and gutting, roof tarping, and compassionate care

Added TWO new Neighborhood Tool Hub locations on Galveston Island and in Beaumont, allowing us to reach, collaborate, and serve with partner organizations addressing community needs in an expanded service area





RAIN OR SHINE, WE SERVE...

Since we were founded in 2014, we have been committed to share all tools and resources in support of disaster recovery efforts at no cost to our partners. This commitment was put into practice in 2024 as our area dealt with the impacts of the derecho in May and Hurricane Beryl in July. While we faced power outages both at our warehouse and in our homes, the team was dedicated to our mission and worked tirelessly to share critical response tools across our community.

We loaned 4,218 tools to 61 different partners supporting disaster recovery in 2024. These tools (debris sleds, portable AC units, generators, pop-up tents, chainsaws, dehumidifiers, and more) equipped more than 2,000 volunteers and were used to:

- Support volunteer reception centers, cooling centers, and food distribution sites;
- Provide power and heat relief to residents and volunteers;
- Provide debris removal support for community and residential cleanup efforts;
- Conduct home repairs, including roof tarping and tree removals;
- and more.

It is with great humility, gratitude, and excitement that we take a step into our next year in service. The past decade would not have been possible without the support and advocacy of our friends and the critical work done in collaboration with our network of nonprofit partners.
